Paul Numrich’s work focuses on the social, civic and theological implications of America’s increasing religious diversity. An ordained Church of the Brethren minister, he serves on the faculty of both MTSO and Trinity Lutheran Seminary at Capital University, where he is professor of world religions and interreligious relations.

Dr. Numrich holds a Ph.D. from Northwestern University, a Master of Divinity degree from Garret-Evangelical Theological Seminary and a Bachelor of Arts degree from Aurora College. His books include *Religion and Community in the New Urban America* (co-author, 2015), *The Faith Next Door: American Christians and Their New Religious Neighbors* (2009), and *Sacred Assemblies and Civic Engagement: How Religion Matters for America’s Newest Immigrants* (co-author, 2007). His article “When a Shared Parking Lot Isn’t Just About Parking” was recently published on the website Studying Congregations.
