### **DR. MARK KELLY TYLER**

Dr. Tyler is a fully affiliated faculty member at MTSO, where he teaches homiletics and African-American studies, and is senior pastor of the historic Mother Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Philadelphia. He holds a doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Dayton, a Master of Divinity degree from Payne Theological Seminary in Wilberforce, and a B.A. in religion from Clark Atlanta University. In 2008, he was appointed pastor of Mother Bethel, the first congregation begun by Bishop Richard Allen, the founder of the AME Church. Mother Bethel has been a spiritual, social and community force since the late 1700s. Tyler, who began teaching at MTSO in 2007, was interviewed by host Henry Louis Gates Jr. for the 2013 PBS series *The African Americans: Many Rivers to Cross*.

### **DR. TIMOTHY REINHOLD EBERHART**

Dr. Eberhart was recently appointed assistant professor of theology and ecology at MTSO. He will serve MTSO and Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill., through a joint appointment. Eberhart earned his Ph.D. from the Graduate School at Vanderbilt University, his Master of Divinity degree from the Vanderbilt Divinity School, and his B.A. in religion from St. Olaf College, where he graduated magna cum laude. His doctoral dissertation was titled "Rooted and Grounded in Love: Joining God's Feast of Holy Communion in the Global Market Economy." Eberhart has taught at Garrett-Evangelical, the Vanderbilt Divinity School and Dakota Wesleyan University. He is an ordained elder in the Dakotas Conference of the United Methodist Church and has served on various boards and committees of the church as well as other community-based organizations.
