Dr. Grace Ji-Sun Kim is associate professor of theology at Earlham School of Religion in Richmond, Indiana. Noted for her work in the fields of feminist, post-colonial and Asian-American theology, she is the author or editor of more than a dozen books, most recently *Mother Daughter Speak* and *Embracing the Other*.

Dr. Kim's writing is featured in websites including the Huffington Post, Sojourners and EthicsDaily. The *Englewood Review of Books* includes her in its list "Ten Important Women Theologians That You Should Be Reading." She earned a Ph.D. from the University of Toronto, a Master of Divinity degree from Knox College and a Bachelor of Science degree from Victoria University.

The Williams Institute was begun in 1981 to honor the late Dr. Ronald L. Williams, professor of theology from 1971 until his death in 1981. The institute has featured speakers from many backgrounds, including theologians, ethicists, poets, biblical scholars, historians, pastoral psychologists and Christian educators.
