Dr. Edwin David Aponte has led the Louisville Institute as executive director since 2015. He also serves as research professor of religion and culture at Louisville Seminary. As a cultural historian of Latinx religions and cultures, he explores faith, spirituality and culture, especially the intersections of race, ethnicity, and religion; congregational studies; and religion and politics.

Dr. Aponte earned Ph.D. and Master of Arts degrees from Temple University, a Master of Arts in Theological Studies from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary and a Bachelor of Arts from Gordon College.

He is the author of *¡Santo! Varieties of Latino/a Spirituality* (2012). He was co-editor of *Handbook of Latina/o Theologies* (2006) and co-author of *Introducing Latino/a Theologies* (2001), both with Miguel A. De La Torre.
