An MTSO faculty member since 2015, Ryan Schellenberg earned his Ph.D. from the University of St. Michael's College in the University of Toronto, his Master of Arts in New Testament at Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary, and his BA at Canadian Mennonite University.

Dr. Schellenberg has conducted extensive research on Paul's life and work. His areas of expertise also include the social history of early Christianity, the books of Luke and Acts, and the parables of Jesus. He has been published in *Harvard Theological Review*, *Journal of Biblical Literature*, *Journal of Theological Studies* and *New Testament Studies*.

His current book project, under contract with Oxford University Press, is titled *Abject Joy: Paul, Prison, and the Art of Making Do*.
